## SAFE RETURN TO SCHOOL PLAN

(as of 01/03/2022)

Benjamin ISD is looking forward to operating school in a normal fashion as we continue the 2021-2022 school year. Despite the challenges of COVID-19, our district will continue to provide an excellent education to our students. The district is committed to focus on the health, safety, and well-being of our students, staff, and community as we continue the 2021-2022 school year.

Benjamin ISD's plan is based on current CDC and TEA guidance and safety recommendations.

- 1. Mask Requirements
  - A. Masks are not required per Governor Abbott's Executive Order GA-36.
  - B. Individuals will be allowed to wear a mask if they choose to do so.
  - C. Masks will be available for those individuals who desire one.
- 2. Modifying Facilities to Allow For Physical Distancing
  - A. Space available will be maximized to the greatest extent possible.
  - B. No minimum distance requirement will be enforced.
- 3. Handwashing and Respiratory Etiquette
  - A. Proper handwashing techniques will be taught to younger students. Students will be reminded of importance to wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds several times a day.
  - B. Multiple hand sanitizing opportunities will be available for Benjamin ISD employees and students throughout the campus in locations such as office, classrooms, cafeteria, etc.
  - C. Students will be reminded that if they need to sneeze to make every attempt to do so into a tissue or in the bend of their elbow.
- 4. Cleaning and Maintaining Healthy Facilities
  - A. Each classroom and restroom will be cleaned and disinfected daily.
  - B. All high-touch/high-traffic areas will be disinfected more frequently.
  - C. The cafeteria will be disinfected between breakfast and lunch period.
  - D. Classrooms will be ventilated to the best extent possible through the circulation of air by means of air conditioning and/or heating units.
- 5. Contact Tracing/Quarantine
  - A. Staff will be required to complete a self-screening process before entering any campus facility.
  - B. Parents/Guardians will be required to screen their children for COVID-19 symptoms each day before sending them to school. Additional screening may be conducted during the school day.
  - C. Students/Staff should not enter a campus building if they experience COVID-19 symptoms.
  - D. Parents must not send children to school if they are lab-confirmed with COVID-19 or if they have been in close contact with a person who has a confirmed case.

- E. Students/Staff should not enter a campus building if they or a household member is awaiting results of a COVID-19 test.
- F. If a student begins experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, he/she will be placed in isolation while parent is contacted.
- 6. Diagnostic and Screening Test
  - A. If a student exhibits symptoms, a parent will be contacted and advised of appropriate follow-up actions.
- 7. Vaccinations
  - A. Staff members were encouraged to receive vaccinations provided by county health officials during the spring of 2020-2021 school year.
- 8. Accommodations for Children with Disabilities
  - A. Individual student IEP's will be reviewed and if accommodations are required, appropriate staff will be notified.
- 9. Coordination with State and Local Health Officials
  - A. The school district will continue to work with local health officials and consider guidance provided through local and state agencies.
- 10. Ensuring Continuity of Services
  - A. The district continues employment of existing staff.
  - B. Staff members will provide intervention for instruction and academic loss due to the pandemic.
  - C. The district will provide services to attempt to meet the social, emotional, and mental health needs of students and/or staff.

This plan will be reviewed every 6 months in relation to updated CDC guidance and with public input.
